BY THE GRACE OF THE ONE AND ONLY GOD

THE MAYOR OF SURAKARTA,

- Considers
- a. that Pancasila as the state's foundation, the nation's philosophy of life and the nation's ideology needs to be internalized in social, nation and state life;
 - b. that Internalization of Pancasila Values is necessary to improve national insight, foster harmony and tolerance in a diverse society and diverse tribes, races, religions, social, economic and cultural groups and to attain the implementation of Pancasila Values in community, national, and state life;
 - c. that to provide direction, foundation and legal certainty in the internalization of Pancasila values, then a regulation is needed in the Municipality to regulate the Internalization of Pancasila values in national and state life;
 - d. that based on the considerations as referred to in letter a, letter b and letter c, it is necessary to stipulate a Municipal Regulation about the Internalization of Pancasila Values;

- Remembers : 1. Article 18 verse (6) of 1945 Constitution the Republic of Indonesia;
2. Law Number 16 of 1950 about the Municipality Formation of Large Cities in The Areas of East Java, Central Java, West Java Provinces and Yogyakarta Special Area (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 1950 Number 45);
3. Law Number 23 of 2014 concerning Municipal Government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia 2014 Number 244, Supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5587) as has been amended several times, most recently by Law Number 6 of 2023 about Government Regulation in Lieu of Law number 2 of 2022 about Job Creation to be Law (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2023 Number 41, Addition to State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 6856);

Stipulate : MUNICIPAL REGULATION ABOUT INTERNALIZATION OF PANCASILA VALUES.

CHAPTER I GENERAL PROVISIONS

Chapter 1

In Regulation Area This Which intended with:

1. Municipality is the City of Surakarta.
2. Municipal Government is the Mayor as an element of the Municipal Government administration that leads the implementation of Government Matters which are authority of the autonomous Municipality of Surakarta.
3. Mayor is the Mayor of Surakarta.
4. Municipal House of Representatives, hereinafter abbreviated as DPRD, is the DPRD of Surakarta.
5. Municipal Officials are an element that assists the Mayor and the Municipal House of Representatives in the implementation of government matters that are authority of the Municipality.
6. National Mentality is the mindset, attitude and behavior of the Indonesian people that are in accordance with Pancasila Values.
7. Internalization is a process of understanding and absorbing that is realized in the forms of writing, speaking, reading, insight, coaching, and practice.
8. Internalization of Pancasila Values is a process of understanding and absorbing which is realized in the form of practicing Pancasila values in community, nation and state life.
9. Pancasila education is a conscious effort to teach about Pancasila in terms of knowledge and in practice.
10. National Mental Training is an effort to train the Indonesian nation to become a nation whose mindset, attitude and behavior are in accordance with the Pancasila Values.
11. The Internalization Center for Pancasila Values is a working group forum that implements Internalization of Pancasila Values in the Municipality.

Article 2

This Municipal Regulation is created to be the guidelines for the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values.

Article 3

The Implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values aims to:

- a. instil an understanding of Pancasila Values to Municipal Officials and State Civil Servants, students, educators, general public, political organizations, and community social organizations;
- b. implant absorption of Pancasila values;
- c. attain the implementation of Pancasila Values in social, national and state life;
- d. implant the value of Mental Nationality;
- e. improve national insights;
- f. realize national character that is based on Pancasila values; and
- g. strengthen local cultures in accordance with Pancasila values.

Article 4

The scope of the Internalization of Pancasila Value includes:

- a. implementation;
- b. contents of the material;
- c. community participation;
- d. coaching and supervision;
- e. collaboration; and
- f. financing.

CHAPTER II

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE INTERNALIZATION OF PANCASILA VALUES

Part One General

Article 5

Internalization of Pancasila Values is held through:

- a. Pancasila Education; and
- b. National Mental Coaching.

Chapter 6

The Implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values is done:

- a. democratically, fairly and in a non-discriminatory manner by upholding human rights, cultural values and social diversity;
- b. as a process of understanding, absorbing and practicing Pancasila Values that last a lifetime in accordance with current and future development progress;

- c. by strengthening synergy and integration between education, the community environment; and
- d. continuously and sustainably forevermore.

Part Two Implementation

Chapter 7

Municipal Government implements the Internalization of Pancasila Values through Pancasila Education and National Mental Coaching.

Chapter 8

- (1) Municipal Government through the Mayor establishes a Center for the Internalization of Pancasila Values to carry out the activity processes of the Internalization of Pancasila Values.
- (2) The Center for the Internalization of Pancasila Values is administered by a board whose members are:
 - a. Elements of Municipal Officials that implement government matters in the fields of:
 - 1. national and political unity;
 - 2. education;
 - 3. culture;
 - 4. human resources;
 - 5. tourism;
 - 6. youths and sport;
 - 7. woman and child empowerment;
 - 8. employment;
 - 9. cooperatives, small and medium-sized businesses, and industry; and
 - 10. trades.
 - b. elements of community:
 - 1. academic figures;
 - 2. public figures;
 - 3. cultural/art figures;
 - 4. religious leaders;
 - 5. family welfare empowerment figures;
 - 6. youth organizations; and
 - 7. mass media

- c. Other institutions:
1. Police;
 2. National armed forces;
 3. Ministry of Religious affairs;
 4. National Narcotics Body; and
 5. National Terrorism Countermeasures Body.
- (3) Municipal Officials not listed as denoted in verse (2) or hereinafter referred to as other Municipal Officials can implement the Internalization of Pancasila Values in accordance with their tasks and functions.
- (4) The provisions of the Implementation regarding the formation, management structure, membership, management and membership criteria, duties, work procedures and secretariat of the Center for Internalization of Pancasila Values as referred to in verse (1) are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

Part Three Targets

Chapter 9

The Implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values is aimed to:

- a. Municipal Officials;
- b. students and college students;
- c. teachers/educators;
- d. leaders of families/religions/traditions/general communities;
- e. political organizations;
- f. ex members of flag-raising teams;
- g. social/youth organizations/other non-profit institutions; and
- h. business worlds.

Part Four Implementation

Chapter 10

- (1) The implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values is carried out through such activities as:
- a. education and training;
 - b. culture and art;
 - c. socialization/seminar/workshop/technical counseling;
 - d. nationality camping/outbound;
 - e. competitions on the Internalization of Pancasila Values;

- f. flag-raising ceremonies in elementary and secondary education levels;
 - g. creation of Pancasila village;
 - h. commemoration of Pancasila anniversary;
 - i. commemoration of Pancasila month;
 - j. commemoration of national holidays;
 - k. playing Indonesia Raya anthem in government and private agencies;
 - l. saying Pancasila greetings; and
 - m. other activities that support the Internalization of Pancasila Values.
- (2) In the Implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values as denoted in verse (1) letter f, schools must hold a flag-raising ceremony at schools on Mondays.
- (3) Schools that do not carry out the flag-raising ceremony as denoted in verse (2) will be subject to administrative sanctions.
- (4) Further provisions regarding administrative sanctions as denoted in verse (3) are arranged in the Mayor's Regulation.

Chapter 11

- (1) The implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values can be carried out by families and/or neighborhoods.
- (2) The implementation as referred to in verse (1) is done in the form of independent activities through informal and non-formal education.

Chapter 12

- (1) The implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values can make use of information and communication technology.
- (2) The use of information and communication technology as denoted in verse (1) is carried out through:
- a. social media;
 - b. media broadcasting; and/ or
 - c. digital and non-digital formats.
- (3) Municipal Government gives supports of information and communication technology facilities and infrastructures as denoted in verse (2).

Chapter 13

- (1) Internalization of Pancasila Values is carried out by prioritizing the following approaches:
- a. participation;

- b. equality;
 - c. openness;
 - d. collaborations among parties;
 - e. creativities;
 - f. innovations;
 - g. academic; and
 - h. local wisdoms.
- (2) The approach as denoted in verse (1) is the basis for implementing the activities of the Internalization of Pancasila Values.

Chapter 14

- (1) The Center for the Internalization of Pancasila Values creates guidelines for the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values.
- (2) Guidelines for the implementation as denoted in verse (1) contains at least:
- a. curricula;
 - b. modules;
 - c. materials;
 - d. regulations; and
 - e. monitoring and evaluation.
- (3) The Guidelines for the implementation as denoted in verse (1) are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

CHAPTER III CONTENTS OF MATERIALS

Chapter 15

- (1) Materials of the Internalization of Pancasila Values include:
- a. Pancasila;
 - b. Nationality Mental Coaching; and
 - c. local contents.
- (2) The contents of Pancasila materials as denoted in verse (1) letter **a** contain:
- a. Pancasila from historical views;
 - b. Pancasila from constitutional judicial views;
 - c. Pancasila from philosophical views; and
 - d. subjective and objective implementations of Pancasila.

- (3) The contents of Nationality Mental Coaching materials as denoted in verse (1) letter b contain:
 - a. nationalism;
 - b. diversity;
 - c. education on anti-intolerance, anti-radicalism and anti-terrorism;
 - d. education on anti-corruption;
 - e. education on anti-drugs; and
 - f. education on anti-sexual violence and bullying.
- (4) The content of the local contents as denoted in verse (1) letter c is adapted to local wisdoms that grow and develop in accordance with the potentials the community have.

CHAPTER IV COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION

Chapter 16

- (1) Community participation in the Internalization of Pancasila Values includes:
 - a. actively participating as an agent of change and driving force in implementing the Internalization of Pancasila Values;
 - b. promoting and supporting the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values;
 - c. assisting for the success of the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values; and
 - d. improving the abilities owned to make the Internalization of Pancasila values a success.
- (2) Community participation in the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values is coordinated and facilitated by the Center for the Internalization of Pancasila Values.

Chapter 17

- (1) Municipal governments can give awards to the communities that play an active role in internalizing Pancasila values.
- (2) The awards denoted in verse (1) are in the form of award certificates, publications and/or incentives.
- (3) The awards as denoted in verse (1) are given by basing on the results of the evaluation done by the Municipal Government through the Municipal Officials that administer government matters in the field of national and political unity.

- (4) The evaluation on the implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values as denoted in verse (3) is based on the guidelines on the implementation of the Internalization of Pancasila Values.

CHAPTER V COACHING AND SUPERVISION

Chapter 18

- (1) The Mayor carries out coaching and supervision on the implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values in the Municipality.
- (2) The coaching and supervision as denoted in verse (1) are technically carried out by the Municipal Officials that administer government matters in the field of national and political unity.
- (3) The Municipal Officials as denoted in verse (2), in implementing guidance and supervision, coordinates with the relevant Municipal Officials.

CHAPTER VI COLLABORATION

Chapter 19

- (1) Municipal government can carry out collaboration to support the implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values in the Municipality.
- (2) The collaboration as denoted in verse (1) is implemented in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER VII FINANCING

Chapter 20

- (1) The financing for the implementation of Internalization of Pancasila Values is sourced from the Municipal revenue and expenditure budget.
- (2) Apart from being sourced from the Municipal revenue and expenditure budget as denoted in verse (1), the financing can be sourced from other legitimate funds in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER VIII
CLOSING PROVISIONS

Chapter 21

Regulation on the implementation of this Municipal Regulation must be stipulated no later than 1 (one) year from the date this Municipal Regulation is enacted.

Chapter 22

This Municipal Regulation is valid on date it is enacted.

So that everyone knows, orders that this Municipal Regulation be promulgated by placing it in the Municipal Gazette of Surakarta.

I. GENERAL

Pancasila is the source of all legal sources and it plays a vital role in social, national, and state life. As the foundation of the state, the nation's way of life and ideology, Pancasila must be preserved and upheld for the sake of the integrity of the Republic of Indonesia. However, in reality, the noble values of Pancasila are increasingly eroded, and the sense of nationalism is declining. Therefore, a deep internalization and practice of Pancasila values are urgently needed today. A lack of understanding of Pancasila values can give rise to radicalism, intolerance, violence, bullying, and other ideologies inconsistent with Pancasila values. This reality necessitates the Internalization of Pancasila Values in social, national, and state life to fortify and prevent the growth of anti-Pancasila movements in the country.

The Internalization of Pancasila Values is also necessary to foster harmony and tolerance in a community which is complex and diversified in ethnicities, races, religions, social, economic, cultural groups and to attain the implementation of Pancasila Values in social, national, and state life. Pancasila values then become a guideline for the implementation of national and state life in Indonesia. Pancasila, which is the fundamental philosophy of the state of Indonesia, in which its values have existed since long time ago, in the forms of traditional, cultural and religious values. In this way the values of all five principles of Pancasila have existed in Indonesia since the beginning of its independence. The Internalization of Pancasila Values is a collaborative attempt by all components of the nation to raise awareness and to create a mindset and behavior that are proper with values contained in Pancasila as a consensus as well as a national identity.

People have to be aware that living in Indonesia requires physical and spiritual readiness, mentally and spiritually to appreciate and accept differences, to respect and accept diversities in ethnic groups, religions, races and groups, each of which has different interests, but within one place, namely Indonesia. In the Municipal context, it is hoped that state administrators (State Civil Servants) and communities will always

understand Pancasila as a guideline in running the state so as not to deviate from the values that have been mutually agreed upon. Legally, a regulation is needed to serve as a legal umbrella and guideline for the Municipal Government and related agencies to be able to better internalize Pancasila values in the City of Surakarta, for the community as well as for the officials within the Municipal Government. To date, Surakarta itself does not have a legal umbrella capable of solving the problems faced by the Municipal Government regarding the Internalization of Pancasila Values. Therefore, in establishing a legal umbrella related to the Internalization of Pancasila Values in the city of Surakarta, it can refer to the Presidential Decree of the Republic of Indonesia Number 24 of 2016 concerning Pancasila anniversary, the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 29 of 2011 concerning Guidelines for Municipal Governments in the Framework of Revitalizing and Actualizing Pancasila Values, and the Regulation of the Minister of Home Affairs Number 71 of 2012 concerning Guidelines for National Insight Education can be used as consideration in preparing a legal umbrella for implementing the Internalization of Pancasila Values in the Municipality. Based on this and in order to provide legal certainty, it is necessary to establish a Municipal Regulation concerning the Internalization of Pancasila Values.

What is meant by "implementation carried out in the form of activities through non-formal education" is:

- a. education and training;
- b. cultural activities;
- c. socialization/seminar/workshop/ technical training;
- d. Pancasila anniversary commemoration; and/or

What is meant by "collaborations among parties", is joint efforts among Municipalities and other Municipalities, between Municipalities and third parties, and/or between Municipalities and institutions or Municipal governments abroad which are based on considerations of efficiency and effectiveness of public services and mutual benefit.

What is meant by "creativities" is that it can utilize both classical and non-classical approaches. Non-classical activities can utilize information technology.

Letter f

What is meant by "innovative" is research, development and/or engineering activities carried out with the aim of developing the practical application and context of new scientific knowledge, or a new method for applying existing science and technology to the products or production processes.

Letter g

What is meant by "academic" is a conscious and effort plan to attain good learning and learning process atmosphere so that students actively develop their potentials to have spiritual religious strength, self-control, personality, intelligence, noble morals, and the skills needed by themselves, society, the nation, and the state.

What is meant by "local wisdom" is the noble values that apply in the social order of life to, among other things, protect and manage the environment sustainably.
